The primary purpose of the meeting is to discuss the challenges around tourism infrastructure on Magnetic Island.

BACKGROUND:

- 1. The publicly listed SeaLink Travel Group is one of Australia's largest transport and tourism companies and operates ferries, buses and light rail nationally and internationally.
- 2. A significant portion of SeaLink's business is based in Queensland, including:
 - passenger ferry services in Townsville, Whitsundays, Gladstone, Stradbroke and Southern Moreton Bay Islands, and Brisbane
 - vehicle barge services in Gladstone, Stradbroke and the Southern Moreton Islands
 - accommodation offerings including Kingfisher Resort and Eurong Village on Fraser Island.
- 3. SeaLink North Queensland is one of Townsville region's most prominent tourism companies and has a strong relationship with the regional tourism organisation, Townsville Enterprises Limited (TEL).
- 4. SeaLink hold the lease for the Breakwater ferry terminal site with property owner Port of Townsville Limited.
- Sealink provides the main mode of transport for visitors and locals alike to Magnetic Island, and is understood to be seeking to provide insights regarding COVID recovery for Magnetic Island.

ISSUES AND SUGGESTED APPROACH:

- 7. It is understood SeaLink wish to discuss future and potential infrastructure development opportunities of the island, particularly concerning the Picnic Bay Foreshore, which has significantly declined over the past decade.
- 8. All Magnetic Island public infrastructure is owned by Townsville City Council. TEL have advised there is no master plan for Magnetic Island despite continued lobbying for this to occur.
- 9. Private investment has more recently occurred in holiday homes and there are some future planned developments and interest in the retail area.
- 10. SeaLink have noted transport challenges on the island that impact visitor experience, specifically the lack of a dedicated visitor shuttle bus service. While TransLink commuter services operate on the island, they do not offer direct routes between tourism destinations.
